# Dear parents/carers,

We had another busy week of learning here at Virginia. The children have been exploring celebrations and in particular, they have looked at the festival of Diwali.

Today we celebrated Children in Need. It was so great to see so many children and adults taking part, thank you for your generous donations. This year in particular, the focus has been on the impact that the coronavirus pandemic is having on the mental health and wellbeing of UK children, and for those who were already facing disadvantages, life has become incredibly difficult. Here is what we have been up to:

#### **EYFS News**

Well done to Reception today for taking part in Children in Need. Everyone wore their spotty clothes or pyjamas and had a great day. This week the children have enjoyed reading the story 'The Monster's pet' they have been using their reading strategies to read the words and find out what happens. They have loved making their own stories afterwards... Fateha and Eda made books out of paper and then retold the story of the Three Little Pigs. Hamood made up his own story about a monster and a ghost! In maths the children have been doubling. They know that doubling is adding the same again, and now they are learning their doubling facts to 3. Everyone has been trying to practise their sight words at home, keep up the good learning reception!

### **Sharing Good Learning**

All of our assemblies are now on the website including good learning assembly. Click on the assemblies tab to access the fantastic learning the children are sharing.

- **Year 1** Have been learning about bonfire night and the gunpowder plot. They made amazing fireworks pictures using black paper and bright pastels.
- **Year 2:** Have been exploring finding the difference between numbers. They used giant numicon to help them. They discovered that finding the difference is the same as subtracting.
- Year 3: Have been learning about the zones of regulations and devised strategies to help them when they are not in the 'green zone'.
- Year 4: This week, Year 4 have been learning about inverted commas. They have created their own dialogue between Grandpa Joe and Charlie from 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' by Roald Dahl.
- **Year 5**: Have been learning dance in PE. They have explored different motifs and different actions to express themselves.
- **Year 6:** Have read and performed Act 1 Scene 3 of Macbeth. They focused on expression and voice projection to bring their characters to life.
