#### Dear parents/carers,

What an exciting last week of term we have had! We have been thinking about belonging and how each of us is unique and different. We have been describing what makes us different and the same and how important it is to celebrate each other's uniqueness. Here is what we have been up to:

#### **Trips and Events**

- As part of their topic 'Londinium', Year 4 visited a Roman amphitheatre at the Guildhall Art Gallery. The children were so excited to be on their first trip of the year! They walked all the way to the gallery and had the museum to themselves! They learned about Roman London and the Roman legacy.
- Year 6 celebrated a World War Two Day, walking through their classroom door was like stepping back in time! The children were dressed as evacuees from London, there was a rations table at the back of the classroom and an air raid shelter at the front. What a fantastic way to bring all the learning to life!
- On Thursday we had our fist Poetry Slam of the Year! The children recorded their poems and each class watched the performances. I can't wait for the next one.

#### **EYFS News**

Reception have been exploring different parts of the school this week and they noticed some interesting changes in the leaves on the trees! Elkhan bought a leaf to show the class that he had found on the way to school. We could see so many different shades of orange, yellow and brown! We experimented with primary colours, mixing them to try and match what we could see. It rained on Wednesday and the children observed how dark the classroom was as the clouds covered the sun. In the dark, we used torches to explore light and shadows, creating some scary images on the ceiling with our hands! Nursery have been exploring numbers by singing lots of number rhymes and using puppets to count our fingers. We have been playing lots of sensory games to help us recognise our shapes, colours and to help us mark make the first letter of our name. We have made a dinosaur park role play area in Nursery with a restaurant upstairs! We've had lots of fun exploring language and mark making inside. We have learnt a lot this first half term including turn taking and learning to be independent. We've worked so hard!
